Southern California Enforcement Sweeps

- I. Bureau's efforts to exercise enforcement pertaining to unlicensed activity in San Diego (2 phases).
 - A. Phase 1 February 8-12, 2016
 - Conducted extensive research including delinquent reports, web searches, and placed calls to businesses. The Bureau's research efforts identified 140 delinquent licenses.
 - 2. Phase 1 of enforcement sweep was to follow up on 140 delinquents.
 - Results:
 - a. 81 inspections conducted;
 - b. 60 licenses determined "out-of-business;"
 - c. 21 \$0 citations written 16 businesses have renewed/complied, five businesses required issuance of \$250 citation during Phase 2;
 - d. After this work was completed, the Bureau still had a list of 59 businesses that required field visits for follow up to gain compliance.
 - B. Phase 2 May 9-13, 2016
 - 1. Goal was to finish enforcement pertaining to all delinquents on the list of 140 from beginning of Phase 1.
 - 59 businesses with delinquent licenses remained after Phase 1. During Phase 2, all 59 were visited and have complied or were issued a \$250 citation.
 - Field Enforcement Teams also identified and cited 15 unlicensed businesses. These were random finds unrelated to the existing list of delinquents.

II. Future Sweeps

- The Bureau will be doing an enforcement sweep in Sacramento/Bay Area and greater Northern California in the coming seven months. The Bureau will bring the field team from Southern California up north to assist in following up on outstanding delinquent licenses and other enforcement issues.
- 2. The Bureau will be conducting research efforts prior to the enforcement sweep to gain solid insight as to what businesses will require a visit.
- III. Bureau Recruiting Working to fill two Field Representative positions in Northern California.





LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

Who Gets Licensed?

If you conduct business in the home furnishings and bedding industry, you are required to maintain a valid license issued by BEARHFTI. Businesses are required to be licensed **BEFORE** they can operate or provide a service (Business and Professions Code section 19049).

If you are unsure what type of license you need or have any questions about the different license types available, contact BEARHFTI by e-mail at homeproducts@dca.ca.gov or by calling (916) 999-2041. You may seek additional information on the BEARHFTI website at www.bearhfti.ca.gov.



ENFORCEMENT

BEARHFTI laws and regulations are enforced through routine inspections. Enforcement also includes the flammability testing of products and the review of product labels, which is performed at BEARHFTI's laboratory. If a licensee refuses to correct violations identified by BEARHFTI, citations and penalties will be assessed or legal action may be taken against the business.

The Bureau of Electronic & Appliance Repair. Home Furnishings & Thermal Insulation (BEARHFTI/Bureau) is the regulatory agency, under the California Department of Consumer Affairs, that oversees the licensing and inspection of businesses that sell upholstered furniture and bedding products to California consumers. BEARHFTI enforces the Home Furnishings and Thermal Insulation Act, which requires all upholstered furniture and bedding products meet certain flammability standards and labeling requirements before they can be offered for sale to consumers.

STATE REGISTRY NUMBERS

BEARHFTI issues a registry number to manufacturers, custom upholsterers, and supply dealers when they are licensed. The registry number is used to identify the business that manufactured the product and the business' location. Consumers can look up the registry number on the Bureau's website www.bearhfti.ca.gov/enforcement/lookup.shtml to obtain manufacturing information.



LABELING REQUIREMENTS

Articles of upholstered furniture and bedding must be properly labeled before they can be offered for sale. Labels must be securely attached to the product and easily visible at the point of sale. For all labels required by BEARHFTI, the size of the label must be a minimum of 2" x 3" and the type must be in black ink and a minimum of 1/8" in size.

LAW LABELS

Every article of upholstered furniture and bedding products must have a law label to identify the manufacturer, their location, and the filling materials that were used during the making of the product. White law labels are used for products made with new material, red law labels are used for products made with secondhand material, and green law labels are used for products made with the consumers' own material. This is an example of a law label for upholstered furniture with new material:

UNDER PENALTY OF LAW THIS TAG NOT TO BE REMOVED EXCEPT BY THE CONSUMER **ALL NEW MATERIAL**

consisting of

REG. NO. XX12345(XX)

Certification is made by the manufacturer that the materials in this article are described in accordance with law.

Minimum type size: 1/8" in height, in all capital letters.

Insert description of filling materials by clearly imprinting in English, using capital letters not less than 1/8" high.

Name and address of vendor or manufacturer (optional).

FLAMMABILITY LABEL AND FLAME RETARDANT **CHEMICAL STATEMENT**

In addition to a law label, flammability labels must be attached to upholstered furniture products to describe which flammability standard it meets. Products meeting Technical Bulletin 117-2013 must also have the flammability chemical statement on the label. The flammability chemical statement describes whether articles used to make the product contains flame retardant chemicals. This is an example of a flammability label for products that meet Technical Bulletin 117-2013:

NOTICE

THIS ARTICLE MEETS THE FLAMMABILITY REQUIREMENTS OF CALIFORNIA BUREAU OF ELECTRONIC AND APPLIANCE REPAIR, HOME **FURNISHINGS AND THERMAL INSULATION TECHNICAL BULLETIN** 117-2013. CARE SHOULD BE **EXERCISED NEAR OPEN FLAME OR** WITH BURNING CIGARETTES.

The upholstery materials in this product:

x contain added flame retardant chemicals

contain NO added flame retardant chemicals

The State of California has updated the flammability standard and determined that the fire safety requirements for this product can be met without adding flame retardant chemicals. The State has identified many flame retardant chemicals as being known to, or strongly suspected of, adversely impacting human health or development.

If consumers want to check if furniture is free of added flame retardant chemicals, they can ask the retailers to show them this label. Retailers are obligated to tip furniture or take other steps to make sure consumers can see this label.

Shared Responsibility

BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS CODE

19072.

Responsibility for compliance with this chapter rests not only with the manufacturer but also with the importer, wholesaler, retailer, or any person having in his or her possession any article of upholstered furniture or bedding, or filling materials with intent to resell contrary to the provisions of this chapter.

(Amended by Stats. 1996, Ch. 1137, Sec. 44. Effective January 1, 1997.)

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BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS CODE

19072.5.

Importers, wholesalers, and retailers shall not sell or resell in California unlabeled upholstered furniture or bedding. Importers, wholesalers, and retailers shall obtain labels from the manufacturer of those articles and shall affix the labels before offering any upholstered furniture or bedding for sale. This does not include furniture used exclusively for the purpose of physical fitness and exercise.

California Code of Regulations

§ 1110. "Withhold from Sale" Tag.

A "Withhold from Sale" tag attached by the Bureau to the material or article of upholstered furniture and bedding withheld from sale shall not be concealed or obstructed from view in any manner. The licensee shall not remove or allow the removal of the withhold from sale tag without the express approval of the Bureau.



Open Flame Barrier Study Full-Scale Validation Mockup Open Flame Tests

The full scale validation tests will be conducted in the full-scale fire testing facility (burn room) under the calorimeter exhaust hood. The heat release rate and the total heat release will be measured and determined in these tests. The test duration will not be pre-determined. The test will continue until either the test specimen self-extinguishes, or is fully consumed by the fire. The test duration will not exceed one hour.

Test Facility:

The mockup test specimen consisting of seat/back/arm cushions will be placed on a mockup chair metal test frame.

Conditioning:

Condition all specimens at a temperature of greater than 18°C (65°F) and less than 25°C (77°F) and less than 55% for at least 48 continuous hours prior to test.

Mockup Test Specimen:




Figure 2. Photo of the Metal Test Frame

The mockup test specimen consists of a seat, a back and two arm cushions as shown in Figure 1. The seat and the back cushions shall be 24" X 24" X 4". The arms shall be 24" X 12" X 4". The back cushion shall rest on the top of the seat cushion. The mockup assembly shall be placed on a metal test frame (the TB 133 mockup test frame shown in Figure 2 or a similar metal frame) during the test.

Test Procedure:

The butane flame ignition source will be applied to the middle of the seat/back crevice for a period of 70 seconds. The heat release rate (kW) and the total heat release (MW) will be recorded continuously during the test.

<u>Lighting the igniter flame</u>: (1) Open the butane tank slowly and light the end of the burner tube. Adjust the gas flow to the appropriate rate to achieve a 240 mm flame. (2) Allow the flame to stabilize for at least 2 minutes.

Starting and performing the test: (1) Place the lit burner tube in the crevice of the mockup so that the end of the igniter is at the center of the mockup equidistant from either edge. (2) Apply the flame for 70 ± 1 seconds, then immediately remove ignition source from the mockup.

<u>Cessation of Test:</u> Allow the specimen to burn out or suppress the fire at any time due to safety concerns.

Reporting the results: The heat release rate shall be recorded during the test. Report the maximum heat release rate and total heat release for the first 10 minutes of the test.

Materials to be used:

Cover Fabrics - Three cover fabrics:

- A fully synthetic
- A blend
- A smolder prone (natural fiber)

Barriers - Numbers to be decided. Possibly 5.

Foam - A low density non-FR polyurethane foam

All tests are done in triplicates.

Note: The seat, back and arm mockup cushions shall be sewn on all sides. No zippers shall be used.

Amount of Materials Needed for Full-Scale Evaluation Tests:

Needs 5 yd² of the cover fabric for each test run.

Needs 5 yd² of the barrier material for each test run.

Needs three 24" X 24" X 4" blocks of foam for each test run.

Cover Fabric Needed:

Total amount of each cover fabric needed (15+15 x N) yd² where N is the number of barriers selected for the full-scale tests.

Barrier Materials Needed:

Total amount of each barrier material needed: 47.5 yd². Obtain a minimum of 50 yd² or 50 lineal yards.

Non-FR Foam Needed:

Total number of foam blocks needed: (27+27xN) where N is the number of barriers selected for the full-scale tests.

Butane gas flame ignition source:

(With flame height and impingement time used by CPSC)

The following ignition source will be used for the full-scale mockup validation tests:

Butane gas burner tube flame ignition source:

- The burner tube will consist of a stainless steel tube, 8.0 ± 0.1 mm (0.315 ± 0.004 inch) outside diameter, 6.5 ± 0.1 mm (0.256 ± 0.004 inch) internal diameter.
- A nominal 240 mm butane flame (10 inch) will be used. The nominal 240 mm butane flame is obtained by establishing a flow rate of butane gas that is 350 ±10 ml/min at 25 °C (77 °F) and 101.3 kPa (14.7 psi).
- Flame height is measured from the center end of the burner tube when held horizontally and the flame is allowed to burn freely in air.
